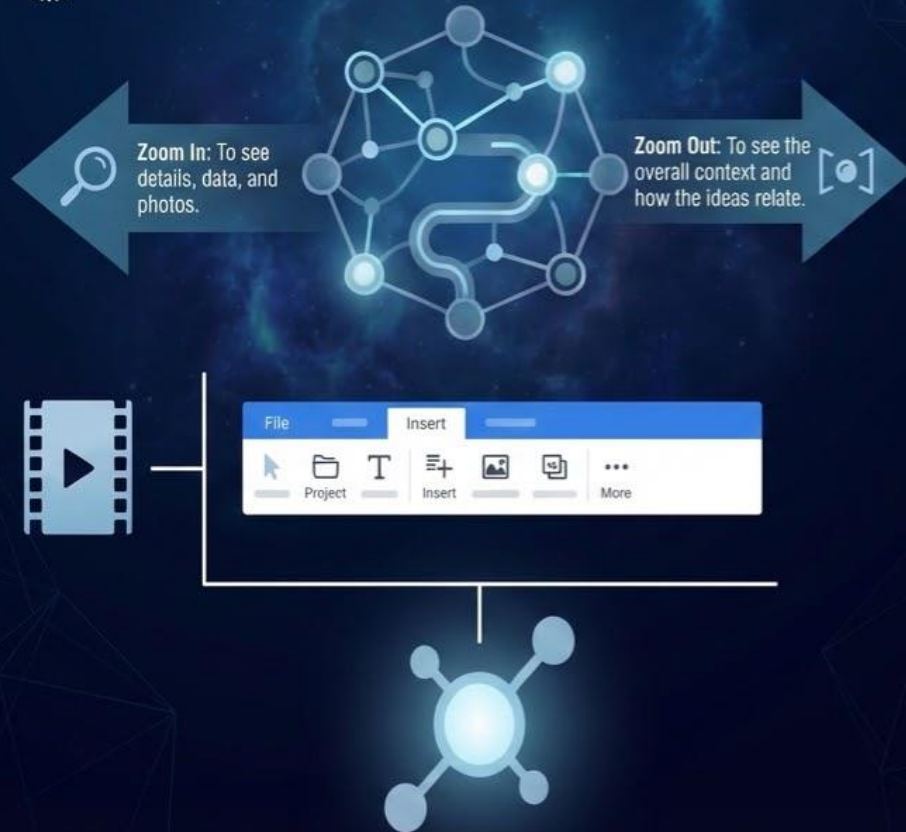

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1. The Concept: “The Canvas”

In Prezi, you don't turn pages; you move around an infinite canvas.

Zoom In: To see details, data, and photos.

Zoom Out: To see the overall context and how the ideas relate.

2. The 3 Elements of the Editor

When you open a new Prezi, you'll see this:

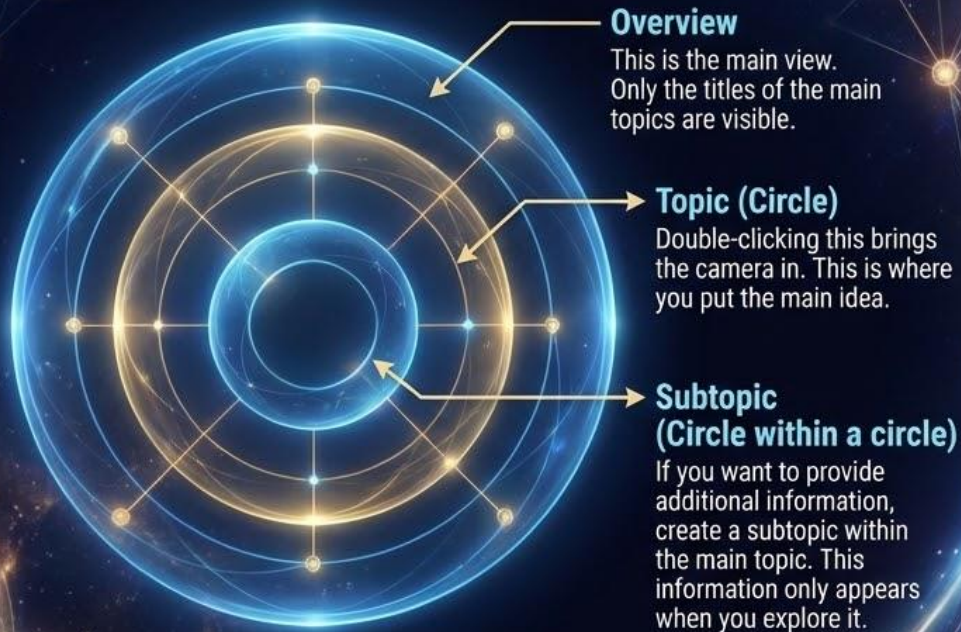
The Left Panel (The Path): It's like a “playlist.” Here you decide the order in which the camera moves. If you move a thumbnail up or down, you change the order of the journey.

The Top Menu (Insert): From here you add everything: text, images, PDFs, YouTube videos, or even icons.

The Central Canvas: Where you drag and drop your “planets” (topics).

4. How to Create: Step by Step

-  **1. Choose a Template:** Don't start from scratch. Go to “Create from a template” and choose one with a structure you like (a path, a map, a brain, etc.).
-  **2. Customize the Background:** Upload a high-quality image related to your topic.
-  **3. Fill the Circles:** Click on the pre-made circles and change the text.
-  **4. Create the Path:** Use the path lines to connect the ideas.

Prezi Video Setup & Best Practices

Prezi Video Setup



-  Click the "Prezi Video" button in the sidebar
-  Select "Appear next to your content"
-  The computer camera will turn on
-  Point to the floating graphics next to you while speaking

3 Mistakes to Avoid



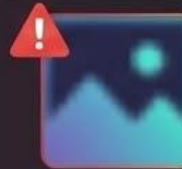
The Dizzy Effect

Don't rotate the circles 360 degrees or place them too far away. The movements should be smooth.



Walls of Text

Prezi is visual. If you're going to include a 20-line paragraph, it's better to use a PDF or Word document. In Prezi, use only key phrases.



Pixelated Images

Because the camera zooms in a lot, if the photo is low quality, it will look terrible. Use large images.
